Subject Verb Agreement

A present tense verb must have subject verb agreement to make sense.

1. Add _s to most verbs if the subject is singular (only one).

The dog walks down the street.

(Hint: if there is an "s" on the verb, you do not need one on the noun!)

2. Do not add _s if the subject is plural.

The dogs walk down the street.

(Hint: if there is an "s" on the noun, you do not need one on the verb!)

3. Do not add _s if the subject is "I" or "you".

I walk the dog every day.

You walk the dog on Tuesday.
